

HOW TO PLAY LANGUAGE ACADEMY

Like most reality shows, in Language Academy you must complete certain tasks. Each contestant places a counter on the Entry Hall. For each room there is a different task (see pages 22 and 23 of the magazine). Work your way around the academy and complete all the tasks. Don't forget that you can only speak in English.

THEME: Answering fan mail


It's time to answer fan mail. Someone asks the question: How do you spend your days in the Language Academy?
